Medical Report

Health Benefits of Wine

Recent studies have boasted of the benefits of wine as a substance that can reduce the risks of cancer, cure heart disease, prevent Alzheimer's and lengthen the life span. How does this occur? How much is too much? Is it all wines?

How does this occur? Some 400 substances in red wine, including tannins and flavonoids, apparently raise the levels of high-density lipoproteins (HDL, or "good" cholesterol) in the blood while decreasing the low-density lipoproteins (LDL, or "bad" cholesterol) and thereby help prevent heart attacks and strokes. HDL is known to lower the risk of arteriosclerosis and heart disease by clearing "bad" cholesterol from the arterial walls and helping eliminate it from the body.

Is it all wines? Most studies focus on substances that are found in red wine, but not white. The reason they are found in red wines is but not white that the substances are natural components of grape skins. Since red wines are fermented on the skins while white wines are not, it is the fermentation of the skins that seems critical to health promotion.

How much is too much? Moderate red wine consumption appears to be the key. One to two glasses of wine daily showed positive benefits in most studies, without contributing to an increase in weight or blood glucose changes.

We're going to look really silly if the Centennial Celebration comes off looking like a county fair instead of the major event it should be. My only hope is, that someone in the State Government will put their foot down and demand a few big observances and refuse to fund the many others.

Oh yes, one other note to the Centennial, it seems that the potential for big bucks, (sound familiar?), has hit the fan here. too. Trademark applications have been made for "The Wright Brothers", "Orville and Wilbur Wright", and the famous first flight photograph. This will in effect control all products intended for the Centennial, including toys, clothing, calendars, and so on. The agency doing this, acting on the wishes of the Wright family, state that they, "don't want to control history, just protect the integrity." Horse pucky! It's money plain and simple. The Wright family gets 65% and the agency gets 35% of all royalties. This puts the folks out at Kitty Hawk in serious trouble, after all, they've been selling those items for already, years without permission. Frankly, I'm getting just a bit sick by all of this. Security Report - 9-11 Internet Hoaxes

News of the devastating terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center and Pentagon swept across the Internet at light-speed the morning of Tuesday, September 11, as did those untrustworthy siblings of the news: rumor, gossip and hearsay. Here, plucked fresh from the digital grapevine, is a sampling of rumors associated with the tragedy within the first few hours and days:

Hijacked airliner was purposely shot down. **Rumor:** "I heard on the radio that the plane in Pennsylvania was shot down because it wasn't responding to radio calls, but can't get confirmed on any of the TV stations." **Status:** False; denied by Pentagon, unsupported by evidence.

More than four planes were hijacked. **Rumor:** "Up to eight airplanes are said to have been hijacked." **Status:** False. The total was four and has not been revised by authorities. (This rumor was widely trumpeted as fact in British newspapers.)

World Trade Center occupants received advance warning. **Rumor:** "I know someone in the world trade center and they called on cell phone... They were warned 45 minutes before first hit to leave building." **Status:** Unsubstantiated; not reported in media.

Britain was also attacked. **Rumor:** "I heard from someone in a chat group who claimed to be from London that Westminster Abbey was hit by hijacked plane too. Trying to verify, but BBC.com is clogged." **Status:** False.

Gasoline shortage/price increase predicted. Rumor: "Due to the events of this morning all ports have been closed. This means no shipping is coming into the United States. This means no oil. Fill your tanks and any portable cans that you have. Do it now before the rush beains." Status: False. though the rumor itself sparked sudden price increases and waiting lines at gas stations in some U.S. cities Tuesday. According to oil industry spokesmen, the U.S. has a "substantial" gasoline supply and some individual stations were simply gouging fearful consumers.

4,000 Jews Didn't Show up for Work at World Trade Center 9/11: http://slate.msn.com/%3Fid= 116813 Rumor: The World Trade Center attack was an Israeli conspiracy and every Jew who worked there was warned in advance to stay home that morning. **Status:** False.

Rumor: Automakers' Contributions to 9/11 Relief: http:// urbanlegends.about.com/library/ blautomakers.htm **Status:** False. This e-mail alleging that non-U.S. auto manufacturers did not contribute significantly to post-September 11 relief efforts is almost entirely false.

The Bin Laden/Gum Arabic Connection: http://urbanlegends. about.com/library/blgum-arabic. htm **Rumor:** Every time you buy a soft drink, this rumor says, you may be contributing funds to Osama bin Laden's terrorist campaign. **Status:** Apparently false.

Rumor: 'Blue packages' in the Mail with Deadly Virus or Poison:

Status: False. In the wake of the September 11 terrorist attacks, the Net is rife with variants of a year-old rumor about deadly chemicals and viruses circulating by parcel post (also known as the "Klingerman Virus").

Budweiser vs. Celebrating Arabs: http://urbanlegends.about. com/library/blbudweiser.htm **Rumor:** Did a Budweiser employee in McFarland, California pull his product from the shelves of a convenience store where Arab employees were seen celebrating the September 11 attacks? **Status:** False.

FADE IN:

1 - EXT. SPACE - DEEP SPACE NINE (OPTICAL)

The station has a small cargo ship docked at one of the pylons.

SISKO (V.O.)

Station log, stardate 46258.5. We have a welcomed visitor, the cargo ship Appalachia. She is bringing us our scheduled regularly supplies plus а few unexpected passengers, Bajorans, returning home. Major Kira has gone to greet them, while I take care of the supplies with Dax and O'Brien.

2 - INT. CARGO BAY - WIDE ANGLE

Present are Sisko, Dax, and O'Brien, along with several N.D. crewmembers. Sisko has a data padd and is logging all of the cargo coming off the transporter pad. O'Brien is operating the transporter and Dax is supervising the N.D. crewpersons handling and storing the cargo.

SISKO

(concerned) So far, none of the food packs we ordered have arrived. I was hoping that they'd be first.

DAX

(smiling) So that's why you decided to 'help us out' down here. That nasty chocolate habit is catching up to you again, isn't it Benjamin?

SISKO (indignant) Is that why you think I took a personal interest in this particular shipment?

Dax shrugs slightly as she checks the label on one of the containers and directs one of the N.D. crewpersons to store it.

> SISKO (to himself) It just so happens, you're right.

Sisko looks around the crowded cargo bay and then poses a question.

SISKO (to O'Brien) How many more containers, Chief?

O'BRIEN (reading) I show five more, Sir. (beat. then:) Ready for the next one, Dax? DAX (nodding) Okay, Miles. Bring it over.

3 - INT. CARGO BAY - TRANS-PORTER PAD (OPTICAL)

A large pallet takes shape on the pad. As soon as the transporter effect is complete, several N.D. crewpersons move in on it, along with Sisko, who scans the labels.

SISKO (working) A-ha! Our food packs. (beat, then:) Well, I'm happy now.

O'BRIEN

(grumpy) I'm not. We still don't have the parts I requested from the last time...

DAX

Don't worry, I'm sure they'll be on the next pallet.

4 - INT. CARGO BAY - WIDE ANGLE

Again, the N.D. crewpersons begin unstacking the containers quickly and hurry off to store it.

SISKO

(happy) With the exception of O'Brien's parts, we've received everything we asked for. Now that's something to celebrate. (beat, then:) When we finish our work here, <u>I'm</u> buying dinner!

O'BRIEN

(dryly)

Oh sure. Now that we have some decent food from Starfleet for the replicators, you feel the need to buy. Where were you when the replicators were running dry?

Dax and Sisko laugh at the barb and continue with their work.

5 - INT. AIRLOCK ENTRY - WIDE ANGLE

THE W RIGHT STUFF

The area is busy with arrivals .Kira, Odo, and Bashir are occupied by their respective tasks. Kira is greeting the Bajorans. Odo is logging the names of the visitors. Bashir is giving the disembarking personnel a quick once over with a medical tricorder. As another small group of Bajorans exit the airlock, Kira moves forward to meet them.

> BASHIR (to Odo) How many more are there?

Odo is logging information into the data padd and is preoccupied.

ODO (working) Only six more, but most of those are routine arrivals, only one more Bajoran refugee...

(looking at Bashir) ...you should be finished in just a few more minutes... unless one of the refugees has a problem...

BASHIR No. So far, so good. They all get a clean bill of health.

ODO (sarcastic) At least one of us is having a good day. So far, I have noted the entry of four less-than-reputable types.

BASHIR Should I be worried

ODO (working) No. It's just the usual riff-raff that Quark's reputation attracts. I'm having my people keep an eye on them.

Kira has been directing the refugees and is a short distance away, she turns to address Odo.

KIRA Is that all of the refugees, Odo? The last Bajoran is now stepping through the airlock and Odo points her out.

ODO (pointing) She's the last one, Major.

6 -- INT. TWO SHOT - KIRA AND OLANA

Kira approaches the last refugee and greets her in a friendly manner.

> KIRA (smiling) Welcome, to Deep Space Nine. I'm the station's First Officer and the Bajoran Liaison, too.

OLANA (smiling) Thank you. It's good to be back on board... . (looking around) ...although, the last time I was here, the conditions weren't quite so hospitable...

Kira works on her own data padd and begins entering information into the device.

> KIRA I'll need to get some basic information. When was the

last time you were here?

OLANA (thinking) Oh, four and a half years or so, right after I lost my second family.

KIRA (surprised) Second family? OLANA (smiling) It's a long story...

Olana hesitates, looking at Kira's rank insignia.

OLANA

Major...?

KIRA (simply) Kira Nerys. Olana is shocked and becomes silent, staring at Kira. Kira becomes concerned.

KIRA (worried) Is something wrong?

OLANA (confused) Yes. I mean, no. I mean, you're supposed to be... I heard that you were killed at Taladan.

KIRA

(surprised)

You heard... (beat, then:) I was wounded, put out of action for awhile, but eventually the Cardassians assigned me to work on this station...

OLANA (realizing) No wonder I couldn't find you! You were here...

Kira is very much confused as to what the refugee is referring to, and tries to figure it out.

> KIRA I'm sorry, just how do you know me?

OLANA (surprised) You mean you don't know?

> KIRA (lost)

No. I don't.

OLANA (smiling) I'm Kira Olana, your sister.

7 - CLOSE-UP ON KIRA. REACTION SHOT

Kira is dumbfounded.

Off her reaction...

FADE OUT:
