Computer Operations Report By John Troan

This month's front cover was an accidental find. I was running a couple of speed checks on my internet connection and did a series of Trek image searches on Google. After a few interesting results -- including some really size comparison nice ship charts -- I stumbled across a new Star Trek-themed site. Memory Alpha is а wiki-designed web site (like Wikipedia) whose content is all things Trek. I poked around a little more and found this month's front cover image. The DS9 Master Systems Display was originally a left-and-right layout, but I edited it to fit on The Wright Stuff cover.

The choice for something from DS9 resonated after a recent article on StarTrek.com marked the 16th that anniversary of the Far Beyond the Stars episode and included comments from several of the regular cast and the recurring quest cast. When looking at what Star Trek is at its core, this episode is one of the best. (I think TNG's Measure of a Man is another one of the best examples of *Trek*'s true core.)

For anyone looking to do some home remodeling, <u>another article</u> has some ideas -- a *Trek* fan in Quebec redid her basement in a *TOS* theme. From the pics in the on-line article, she did a great job of getting the little things right.

Star Trek On-Line By Larry Cox

Star Trek On-line (STO) (sto.perfectworld.com) is а massive, interactive, multiplayer on-line game based on all the series and movies in the Star Trek franchise. Players begin as fresh graduates of StarFleet Academy and assume the command of their first star ship as Captain with a rank of Lieutenant. From there they move up in rank by completing various assigned StarFleet missions from Command and deep space encounters with foes familiar to the Star Trek galaxy and some new ones. In addition to buildina on rank, Captains competing in missions also have a opportunity to acquire items such as weapons, ship enhancements and materials that can kept and used or sold for credit to acquire other items. Captains can also join fleets (groups of other players) and compete with or against them in combat situations.

In October 2013, STO became "free to play"; that's when I joined. I had seen the on-line ads for it long ago but for various reasons had not signed up to play.

Original Series - Star Light, Star Bright By Brad McDonald

After depleting all of my recently completed (within 15-20 years or so) scripts for the *Kitty Hawk* newsletters, I'm finally forced to go back to my earlier efforts. These stories were written for the original series and completed while *Star Trek* was still on or shortly thereafter. At the time I did not know the correct format, so I wrote them in a line by line style.

In the late 80's and into the 90's. when Next Generation and other series started, I rewrote some of those earlier efforts using the correct format. By then I had acquired books, attended classes and joined writing groups which gave me a better understanding of how to format scripts for T.V. I'm not a professional by any means and just write for my own pleasure. However, I did submit several stories to Paramount using their submission open policy and registered all of my stories with the Writers Guild of America.

In moving the stories from the original series to the newer ones, I substituted characters, so Spock became Data or Odo, Kirk became Picard or Sisko and so on. I made the appropriate changes in personality and such and it seemed to work.

Now I've gone back to the original series but have put the stories in the acceptable format. The stories are basic, not polished to my liking and are a bit long, but please accept them as they were intended: a fan's wish to be part of the *Star Trek* universe. We present the first one here for a few moments' diversion.

Star Light; Star Bright was written in the summer of 1967 and typed on my mother's typewriter over a few weeks. I rewrote it as a *Next Generation* story, but now present it as it was originally intended with the following change. I have set it in the second half of the third season to include Chekov and certain events referenced herein. Please note that it is back in the teaser and four act format, which was standard in the 60's.

TEASER

EXT. SPACE - U.S.S. ENTERPRISE

Enterprise is orbiting a planet, a large star cluster is visible in the B.G.

KIRK (V.O.)

log, Stardate Captain's 5625.4. We have discovered a cluster of stars with an unusual abundance of Class Μ planets. So far. twenty-two worlds have explored and been cataloged. We are now beginning studies on one final world before heading home for a much needed rest and shore leave.

INT. ENTERPRISE -TRANSPORTER ROOM - WIDE ANGLE

Landing party is getting equipment from wall racks, present are SPOCK, SULU, CHEKOV, UHURA and MCCOY. KYLE is assigning communicators and tricorders. KIRK enters room.

KIRK

Everybody ready?

McCoy notices that Kirk is not joining the shore party.

MCCOY Jim, you're not going?

ON KIRK

KIRK Bones, I'm worn out. Twenty-two explorations in sixty days is enough. You and Spock can have the "honor" this time.

NEW ANGLE - ON TEAM

MCCOY (shrugging) Suit yourself, but I hear it's a real paradise.

SULU Readings show conditions just like Earth's Tahiti...

UHURA ...but no natives...

CHEKOV ...so we don't have to worry about cultural contamination.

KIRK You all sound like a travel brochure. (beat)

Thanks anyway, I'll pass.

TWO SHOT - KIRK AND SPOCK

In the B.G. the team steps up to the transporter pad.

SPOCK Usual procedures Captain?

KIRK

Affirmative, Mr. Spock, report in every thirty minutes unless you find something... fascinating.

(quietly to Spock) And don't find anything fascinating. Make it a quick trip... I'm going to take a nap.

Spock is surprised.

SPOCK (subdued) Understood, sir. Spock joins the team on the transporter platform.

SPOCK Mr. Kyle, ready to transport.

KYLE Aye, Sir. Transporting now.

Transporter effect begins.

EXT. PLANET SURFACE MID-DAY - WIDE ANGLE

The group arrives in an open meadow and immediately begins taking readings and spreading out.

SULU Just as we thought, typical Class M; slightly richer oxygen content than Earth. No surprises here.

UHURA 22% humidity and 75 degrees Fahrenheit, not bad at all.

CHEKOV About the "no surprises", I'm picking up readings indicating a small structure.

SULU You're joking, on an uninhabited planet?

NEW ANGLE - ON SPOCK

Spock is now looking at his tricorder and nodding in agreement.

SPOCK

Mr. Chekov is correct. The structure is simple but definitely man-made.

AS BEFORE - WIDE ANGLE

UHURA

Maybe it's just a marker, left by a previous team of explorers.

SULU

Possible, but it is a surprise, maybe we should notify the Captain...

SPOCK

Not just yet Lieutenant. Let's check it out first. Mr. Chekov, lead the way.

CHEKOV (off tricorder) Aye, sir. One hundred fifty meters bearing zero nine five relative.

NEW ANGLE

The group heads into a nearby forest, walking in single file.

WIDE ANGLE - EDGE OF WOODS

The group exits the woods into a park. In the center is a small stone well with a wood roof.

SPOCK

Mr. Chekov?

CHEKOV (off tricorder) Just as it appears, sir. Made of native stone and wood.

Uhura steps forward, smiling and delighted.

UHURA Pavel, it's a wishing well!

Off her reaction...

FADE OUT.

END OF TEASER

ACT ONE

FADE IN:

(NOTE: Episode credits fall over opening scenes.)

ACTION IS CONTINUOUS FROM TEASER

The group is gathered around the old stone well. Chekov is busy taking detailed readings, Sulu is examining the construction and Uhura is still beaming.

SPOCK Miss Uhura, you said this was what type of well?

UHURA

A wishing well Mr. Spock.

TWO SHOT – MCCOY AND SPOCK

Spock is unimpressed, the others pick up on his doubts and try to 'enlighten' him.

MCCOY

It's a wishing well, Spock. With all your vast knowledge of the universe, don't tell me you've never heard about wishing wells?

Spock is mildly annoyed by McCoy's statement.

SPOCK

Really doctor, I hardly include fairy tales and magic as necessary information. What makes it is so unique?

WIDE ANGLE – AS BEFORE

UHURA

It's like wishing on a star. You know, "Star light, star bright; first star I see tonight."

SPOCK

It has been my observation that the 'first star' which appears on Earth is usually Venus, which is a planet.

ON MCCOY

true.

MCCOY (mock surprise) Well I'll be, no wonder none of my wishes ever came

AS BEFORE - WIDE ANGLE

Uhura, Chekov and Sulu laugh. Spock continues work.

SPOCK (off tricorder) Curious, this structure is ancient, about 10,000 years or more.

CHEKOV

Or why?

NEW ANGLE

Spock moves closer to inspect the well.

SPOCK Unimportant. In any case it is no longer functional. There is no water present.

SULU Well I like it here. Can we recommend shore leave, Mr. Spock?

ON SPOCK

SPOCK

I believe the Captain is anxious to return to Star Base 121 as soon as possible. Our recommendations for shore leave would carry little weight in his decision.

ON MCCOY

MCCOY Well, how about a little help?

UHURA (o.c.) What kind of help?

McCoy pulls a data tape from his bag and drops it in the well.

SULU (o.c.) Doc? What are you doing?

MCCOY Quiet! I'm making my wish!

CHEKOV (o.c.) What is it?

MCCOY

(smiling broadly) If I tell you, the wish won't come true.

ON SPOCK

He is shaking his head in disbelief.

SPOCK

I doubt wishes will come true regardless of the conditions.

Spock's communicator chirps and he opens it.

WIDE ANGLE

McCoy is grinning and elbowing Sulu to indicate the wish has come true.

SPOCK (continuing) Spock here.

KIRK (v.o.) Sorry, but the trip to paradise is canceled. We just received an S.O.S.

SPOCK Affirmative, Captain.

McCoy is disappointed.

MCCOY Not the news I was wishing for. Guess Spock is right after all.

UHURA No wonder your wish didn't come true doctor, you used a blank data tape.

McCoy is confused.

SULU

It has no value.

CHEKOV According to Russian tradition, you must use something of value. In the old days they used coins.

ON SPOCK

Listening with a detached interest he activates communicator.

SPOCK (to communicator) Spock to transporter. Landing party ready to beam up.

KYLE (v.o.) Ready sir. INT. ENTERPRISE – BRIDGE – WIDE ANGLE

Shore party exits turbolift and take stations, relieving N.D. crewpersons. Spock is the last to exit and stops at captain's chair.

SPOCK

Captain?

TWO SHOT - KIRK AND SPOCK

Kirk is studying the main viewer intently and hands Spock a tricorder.

KIRK

The S.O.S. is from a freighter.

SPOCK They are in need of assistance?

ON KIRK

KIRK Not exactly. Look at the last part of the transmission. (to Chekov) Pavel, lay in a course for the Romulan neutral zone, sector four. (to Sulu) Ahead warp factor six,

helmsman, as soon as you're ready.
