## 2009 Space Exploration Alliance Legislative Blitz By Alastair Browne

The 2009 Space **Exploration** Alliance (SEA) took place Washington, D.C., from February 22-24. This is where space advocates from around the country gather and walk the halls of Congress to explain the importance of space exploration and development to our senators and representatives. This is so they will support, or continue to support, the appropriations bills as they pass through the House and Senate.

The Space Exploration Alliance is the collaboration of about 13 space advocacy groups, among them the National Space Society (of which I represent); the Mars Society; Students for the Exploration and Development of Space; and the National Society for Black Engineers, among others. This partnership, with combined а membership of over 700,000 people, maintains the goal of the human and robotic exploration of space through the communication to elected officials, corporate and industrial representatives, and other prominent organizations with the means of achieving this goal.

Each year, since 2004, the SEA recruits members to go to Washington, roam the halls of Congress in order to speak to senators and representatives to continue to fund our space program, even in these difficult economic times, because this is vital to the future of America as a whole, even if we are not aware of it.

On Sunday, February 22, we all (about 30-35 of us) gathered at the Marriott Hotel in Arlington, Virginia, where we were briefed on protocol with government officials. We were to visit a total of 128 government reps, of which 37 were U.S. Senators, and the rest, U.S. Representatives.

Among the subjects to be discussed were space solar power, private launch services, and the new Constellation programs with the Ares I and V vehicles, with the capability of not only exploring the Moon, but also near Earth asteroids.

The next morning, Monday, February 23, we began our blitz, which lasted two days. We all met in the Sam Rayburn Building, downstairs in the cafeteria, and were assigned our own separate groups of four. Our group leader was a member of the National Society of Black Engineers, and he did most of the talking when we visited the offices of certain government officials, but we all added our input when needed.

In our group, we mostly discussed the energy problem, relevant to today's headlines, and how space solar power can help solve this. We can launch a solar power satellite into geosynchronous Earth orbit (22,300 miles up above one fixed point on the Earth, 24 hours a day), have the satellite collect the sun's rays in the vacuum of space, convert it to microwaves, and beam them down to a 10 mile by 10 mile (100

square miles) receiving antenna, called a rectenna, where the microwaves would be converted back to five to 10 billion watts (gigawatts) of electricity for distribution to wherever needed. This could make us more energy independent, preserve the environment, and even make us an energy exporter. Should we decide to obtain resources to build these satellites from the Moon and asteroids, this could not only get us into space, but generate for us a multi-trillion dollar economy.

That's a lot to take in, but that was mainly our own group's discussion during those two days.

We never saw the senators and representatives themselves, but we met their legislative correspondents, and they listened to us. Most of them favored our cause, since they themselves listen to many different causes each day, all stressing that they are just as important.

However, the trick here is to convince these officials that they are not "spending" money on space, but "investing" it, knowing that there will be a payback of seven to 14 times the amount they originally put in, while saving our economy at the same time. This means generating new high-tech jobs; putting math, science, and technology back into the educational system; and making America once again competitive with the rest of the world.

## From the Kitchen By Lynn Stone

The Enterprise had hosted one delegation after another. Each meal reflected each delegation's dietarv requirements and each member of the Enterprise was expected to partake. Now that the social events were over, the crew was looking forward to some "normal" Multiple requests came from all food. over the ship for Chef to prepare some kind of pasta dish. Chef did not disappoint. The following guick and easy recipe became a ship's favorite.

Fettuccine with Chicken Breasts (makes 8 servings)

- 12 ounces uncooked fettuccine or egg noodles
- 1 cup made at home Ranch Dressing (recipe follows)
- 1/3 cup Dijon mustard
- 8 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves, pounded thin
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 1/2 cup dry white wine

Cook fettuccine according to package directions; drain. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Stir together dressing and mustard; set aside. Pour fettuccine into oiled baking dish. Sauté chicken in butter

in a large skillet until no longer pink in center. Transfer cooked chicken to the bed of fettuccine. Add wine to the skillet; cook until reduced to desired consistency. Drizzle over chicken. Pour the reserved dressing mixture over the chicken. Bake at 425 degrees F about 10 minutes, or until dressing forms a golden brown crust.

- 1 (8 oz.) carton of plain, fat free yogurt
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 envelope Hidden Valley Buttermilk Dressing

I don't understand, what is a Borg?

**PARIS** 

(working)

Trust me, you don't want to meet them, and yes Mister Tuvok, that is a <u>definite</u> personal prejudice.

TUVOK (simply)

Understandable.

**JANEWAY** 

Any readings on the Borg ship?

KIM

Negative. Do you wish me to continue scanning?

Janeway is about to chastise the young officer when she realizes his point.

**JANEWAY** 

Minimal scans, let's not reveal our location in the process, correct?

KIM

Aye, Sir

Neelix stands and moves towards Janeway.

**NEW ANGLE** 

NEELIX

(impatient)

Isn't anybody going to tell me what a Borg is?

**JANEWAY** 

Your worse nightmare Neelix. A race of violent beings, half humanoid and half machine.

**CHAKOTAY** 

First they take your technology and then they take you.

**PARIS** 

Then they convert you to their own race, make you one of them.

NEELIX

(indignant)

I wouldn't let that happen!

TUVOK

They do not give you a choice.

**KIM** 

You either join or die.

NEELIX (horrified)

I think I'd rather die.

**JANEWAY** 

Excellent choice.

(beat; thoughtfully)
Question is, what are they

doing in this quadrant?

**PARIS** 

(working)

Nebula dead ahead Captain, we'll be there in five minutes.

**CHAKOTAY** 

Any more on the Borg?

TUVOK

(working)

Most curious. I do not read another ship in this sector.

**JANEWAY** 

Then they're cloaked?

TUVOK

Possibly.

JANEWAY (sarcastic)

Wonderful. They have another advantage...

Kim is very busy and working hard on something. Janeway notices and

becomes curious, moving towards him.

#### TWO SHOT - JANEWAY AND KIM

**JANEWAY** 

(to Kim, curious)

Ensign, you have something to report?

KIM

(working)

Nothing positive... but I'm not convinced it's a ship.

**JANEWAY** 

Care to explain?

KIM

(working, hesitant)
It reads more like a... beacon

#### **NEW ANGLE**

Tuvok overhears and begins to run his own checks. Chakotay moves behind Tuvok, it makes Kim just a bit self-conscious, but he continues.

**KIM** 

(working)

It is a signal beacon...

(guessing)

Could be a distress call, It's constant and repeating.

TUVOK

(working)

Confirmed.

**CHAKOTAY** 

Are we sure it's Borg?

**TUVOK** 

Yes. I have cross checked it against Starfleet records from the incident at Wolf 359.

Everyone reacts visibly at the mention of Wolf 359.

**CHAKOTAY** 

And possibly a distress call, interesting...

**PARIS** 

Nebula in sixty seconds, in case anyone cares.

**JANEWAY** 

Understood, Lieutenant. Come to a stop once you've entered. Go to yellow alert, then we'll give the situation some proper consideration.

Neelix becomes nervous at her suggestion. Chakotay is interested in her thinking and moves to her side.

#### **NEELIX**

Like what? Whether you wish to die or become a Borg?

The bridge crew ignores his comment, but not entirely.

**CHAKOTAY** 

(quietly to Janeway)

Just what do you have in

mind?

**JANEWAY** 

Curiosity, Mister.

**CHAKOTAY** 

Curiosity killed the cat, Captain.

She eyes him with suspicion and suppressed smile.

**JANEWAY** 

Is that an old Indian saying?

**CHAKOTAY** 

(slight smile)

It's not even an old Indian saving it.

**JANEWAY** 

If you know the saying, I trust you know the standard response.

Chakotay simply nods in acknowledgment.

**PARIS** 

(to no one)

Curiosity killed the cat, but the satisfaction brought him back.

(beat)

All stop, Sir. We're in the Nebula. Safe, at least for now.

NEELIX.

(nervous)

Shouldn't we... keep going?

Janeway ignores Neelix again, but she is definitely up to something. We can see her mind set to working.

**JANEWAY** 

Kim? Call up the records on distress calls.

**KIM** 

(surprised)

We have such a record?

TWO SHOT - JANEWAY AND CHAKOTAY

JANEWAY

(confident)

Logs of the Enterprise, I'd say it was within the last three years.

CHAKOTAY

(matter-of-factly)

You know something?

**JANEWAY** 

The Enterprise once discovered a wrecked Borg scout ship and it was broadcasting a distress signal. We can compare ours with that one.

**CHAKOTAY** 

(smiling)

Maybe I should have stayed in Starfleet, I missed out on some very interesting occurrences.

**JANEWAY** 

You don't know the half of it.

**BRIDGE - WIDE ANGLE** 

TUVOK

I am unable to continue scanning the Borg signal, interference from nebula.

**JANEWAY** 

(smug)

That's a double-edged sword mister.

**NEELIX** 

(hopeful)

Meaning they can't' scan us either?

**PARIS** 

That's the general idea

**CHAKOTAY** 

(to Janeway)

Just what <u>do</u> you have in mind?

ON JANEWAY

She lowers her voice just a bit and meets Chakotay's eyes, speaking firmly.

**JANEWAY** 

When the Enterprise encountered the damaged

Borg ship, they found a survivor. They were able to tap into the Borg collective and had planned to place a self destruct command into their control circuit.

(beat)

For some reason, they altered their plan. But, if we are presented with a similar opportunity, I'm under orders to carry out the original plan at any cost.

### CHAKOTAY'S VOICE (o.c.)

Orders?

JANEWAY (controlled)

Upon receiving command of this ship Admiral Nechayev gave me a standing order, destroy the Borg at any opportunity.

(beat, angry)

Almost twelve thousand lives lost and over forty ships lost or severely damaged... you bet, orders.

(to Kim)

How's that analysis coming along?

#### AS BEFORE

KIM

You were right about the records...

Janeway moves to look over Kim's shoulder and studies the data on his viewer.

JANEWAY

What's wrong?

KIM

It's not a distress beacon.

TUVOK

It is a directive beacon.

**PARIS** 

A what?

TUVOK

Simply put, it is a set of directions or operational orders.

**CHAKOTAY** 

A communications relay?

TUVOK

Quite possible.

**JANEWAY** 

Not as good as I had hoped for, but it does have possibilities.

**CHAKOTAY** 

Such as?

**JANEWAY** 

Tuvok, the Borg collective operates on a unified command structure. What would happen if we severed that link?

**TUVOK** 

(thoughtfully)

Confusion and disorientation, but only for a brief time. I suspect they have contingency plans for just such an event. They are a very... efficient race.

(beat)

**PARIS** 

If nothing else, it may cause the Borg to slow their advances.

TORRES' VOICE

Engineering to bridge.

Janeway taps her comm badge.

**JANEWAY** 

What is it Torres.

**ENGINEERING - ON TORRES** 

**TORRES** 

Captain, we've got a problem. I used what little reserves we had to get us out of harms way. But being inside the nebula is putting a tremendous strain on our systems Either we leave the nebula within thirty minutes, or our power will be depleted.

**BRIDGE - AS BEFORE** 

Janeway is obviously unhappy with the news.

**JANEWAY** 

Looks like we can't play cat and mouse anymore.

KIM

(hopeful)

Well, if it's just a beacon maybe it's automated.

(beat)

There may not be any Borg nearby.

**PARIS** 

And if there are? We're 70,000 light years from reinforcements or assistance and our power levels are minimal.

CHAKOTAY

Not much of a choice, stay in the nebula until we lose power, or go out there...

He nods towards the main viewer.

CHAKOTAY (continuing)

...and take our chances.

Off the crew's reaction...

FADE OUT.
