

## Computer Operations Report By John Troan

First, a hearty welcome to our new subscribers who signed up at Crystal Coast Con. If you haven't done so already, browse through the <u>newsletter archive</u> portion of our <u>on-line media archive</u>.

Comp Ops had a major problem to deal with recently -- complete failure of one of the computer cores. After replacing the faulty storage modules, it took a full system rebuild was needed. Fortunately, all systems are now functioning nominally.

Now that I've figured out how to carve out time to work on our first podcast (radio play), it's now coming along quite nicely. Act I has been rough-cut and needs mostly polishing before it gets posted to the download page.

Brad and I are already getting the second podcast script ready for recording at least parts of the dialog over Christmas while some of the crew is in town during the holidays. We'll have copies of the script at the December meeting and we can begin to see who wants to read which part(s). Several of the parts are small enough that some people can read multiple parts that are scattered across different scenes. I've already "volunteered" Brad for the character I think he's best suited for -- and not the narrator this time around.

The front cover of this issue shows the Orion capsule being stacked on a Delta IV Heavy rocket at Kennedy Space Center's Launch Complex 37. Launch for this first test flight is scheduled for a week after Thanksgiving, with a 7:05 am ET liftoff. The launch window -- the period of time during which the launch can occur in -- is a couple hours long, so there's plenty of time for a (short) delay if a small glitch crops up. The flight is scheduled to go about 4.5 hours and ends with a Pacific Ocean splashdown well away from the San Diego coast. NASA has posted the "Trial by Fire" video

that shows a lot of what the test flight will involve.

A couple of weeks after that is the fifth contracted <u>SpaceX cargo</u> <u>mission</u> to the space station (and sixth mission overall), which will deliver almost two tons of experiments, technology demonstrations, and general supplies.

NASA has recently released <u>a</u> new version of Jupiter's Europa. They still used the original images from the *Galileo* mission in the late 1990s, but have used more modern image processing to create this new version.

On Mars, Curiosity is continuing its research of the lower terrain around Mount Sharp, focusing on the first rock outcrop it encountered upon reaching Mount Sharp. Curiosity performed an initial survey of the area and is now conducting a more detailed examination of some of the rocks to determine which ones will be drilled into during the third pass.
