
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

Away Mission—Exploring New Worlds at the Skirball Museum By Ruth and Darrin Sutherland

The Skirball Cultural Center in Los Angeles, California, consists of a museum, performing arts center, classrooms, and a conference center dedicated to the study of the Jewish culture.

In 2021, the Skirball Museum launched the "Exploring New Worlds" exhibit. It was designed to celebrate both the 55th anniversary of *Star Trek* as well as the Jewish heritage of Leonard Nimoy.

Thankfully the exhibit was a huge success and was extended into early 2022. We were on a trip to California and were able to visit the museum on the last day of the exhibit on February 20, 2022.

The exhibit was amazing and better than we ever imagined. We felt so lucky that it worked out for us to visit it.

The museum lined the driveway to the center with beautiful banners featuring the *Enterprise* as well as large banners featuring Kirk and Spock at the entrance to the museum.

Inside the museum, the staff had playfully hidden tribbles around other displays on the way to the main room, and there were posters featuring Spock and Uhura on the walls and stickers of the delta insignia on the floor leading to the exhibit hall.

At the end of the hallway leading to the exhibit was a replica of Kirk's command chair that visitors could sit in for a spectacular photo. At the entrance to the exhibit was a large wall display featuring Spock and the Vulcan salute, along with the words to the saying "Live Long and Prosper." Of course, *Star Trek* fans will know

that Leonard Nimoy based the Vulcan salute on a Jewish blessing.

We gasped as we entered the cavernous exhibit hall that stretched as far as our eyes could see, and we realized the exhibit was going to be massive.

A filming model of the *Enterprise* D was one of the first displays, along with original uniforms of most of the characters from *The Next Generation* as well as props from TNG, including phasers and a Klingon Bat'leth.

There were also filming models of a Romulan Warbird, a Klingon Battle Cruiser, and a Borg Cube. You could even stand in a Borg Regeneration Alcove and climb through a Jefferies Tube.

At the center of the large room were the crown jewels of the exhibit, which were the original helm and navigation station from the original *Star Trek* series, along with Kirk's original command chair.

There were also parts of Spock's original science station and Uhura's original communications station, along with original props including phasers, tricorders, medical scanners, and miniature filming models of the *Enterprise* and a Klingon Battle Cruiser. There were even original tribbles from "The Trouble with Tribbles."

The centerpiece exhibit also featured the original costumes from Kirk, Spock, McCoy, and Uhura, along with Kirk's Mirror Universe costume. There was also a section of Vulcan costumes, including both Sarek's and T'Pau's original costumes, as well as the original Gorn costume.

Further into the exhibit were displays from most of the other *Star Trek* shows and movies, including Spock's space suit from *The Motion Picture* and Khan's costume from *The Wrath of Khan*.

There was T'Pol's costume from *Enterprise* along with Sisko's uniform from *Deep Space 9*. Also on display were Janeway's and Seven of Nine's costumes, along with Janeway's command chair from *Voyager*.

At the end of the exhibit was a virtual display area where visitors could film themselves going on multiple away missions. There were props to hold, including phasers and tricorders, and each mission would begin by standing on a transporter pad and then beaming to a new location to explore or battle enemies in the virtual environment.

We made a point to go through every one of the away missions, which were all good fun.

As we left the exhibit, we marveled at the wonderful displays on the walls, featuring everything from President Obama doing the Vulcan salute with Nichelle Nichols to original script pages from "The Cage" pilot episode and so much more.

Of course, the exhibit exited into a museum shop, and we happily purchased T-shirts, hats, and other trinkets to help remember this truly out of this world exhibit.

James T. Kirk. Glad to meet you, Doctor. Are you the ship's chief medical officer?

Kirk resumes eating.

YARDLEY

(embarrassed)

No, hardly, just a surgeon. Dr. Crittenden is our C.M.O. I've only been aboard for three months.

KIRK

(eating)

Where were you before?

YARDLEY

(eating)

The Potemkin, Captain Barefoot's ship. I enjoyed the crew and work, but...I go where they send me.

She shrugs, lost in her words, distant.

YARDLEY

(continuing)

Ptolemy is okay, but it's not quite...

KIRK

(eating)

Family, right?

Yardley brightens and studies Kirk.

YARDLEY

(eating)

You understand, don't you?

ON KIRK

KIRK

As a career officer, I've learned to appreciate the crew as more than just Starfleet personnel.

ON YARDLEY

She stops eating and studies Kirk.

YARDLEY

So it's true. You really are more than a ship's captain. I've heard stories about you and the Enterprise crew.

NEW ANGLE

Kirk becomes dramatic and has fun with her.

KIRK

NEW ANGLE

(moving)

All aboard! We've got a long way to go.

(beat)

Where's the doctor?

YARDLEY (O.C.)

I'm here, stop complaining.

Kirk turns to see Yardley walking towards him with medical kit over her shoulder. In B.G. Sarek, Sipowitz, and Storn are boarding the shuttle. Kirk moves to greet Yardley.

TWO SHOT - KIRK AND YARDLEY

KIRK

(moving)

You didn't say anything about being part of this team.

YARDLEY

(smiling)

I was trying to see if all the stories about Captain Kirk were true.

KIRK

To find out if I'd take care of you, before you volunteered.

She's 'caught' and smiles weakly.

YARDLEY

Something like that.

KIRK

Not too late to change your mind.

YARDLEY

Yes, it is...let's go 'save the universe' again, Captain.

They walk together and enter the shuttle.

NOGURA'S P.O.V.

We see shuttle moving off quickly.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT TWO

EXT. SPACE - PTOLEMY AND STARFIELD Ptolemy is stopped and we see shuttle exit.


INT. PTOLEMY - OBSERVATION DECK - ON NOGURA


He's looking out a window.
